Dental Cleaning with Full Mouth Extractions

- Professional Dental Cleaning as listed to the left
 - Full mouth extractions
 - Post-Operative Pain medications
 - Post-Operative Antibiotics
- This is often necessary for pets who lack proper dental care throughout their life, or for pets with underlying immune disorders or genetic predisposition to severe dental disease. Grade IV periodontal disease is IRREVERSIBLE and often results in many extractions to help your pet.

Extractions: **\$66-\$276 per tooth**

Extractions are often necessary for Grade II, III and IV Dental Disease in addition to Dental Cleaning

Grades of Feline Tartar



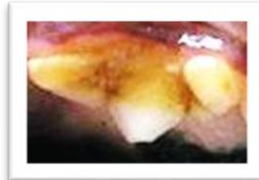
GRADE I

Normal
Mild plaque present
No Tartar



GRADE II

Moderate Plaque
Tartar covers
<50% of tooth



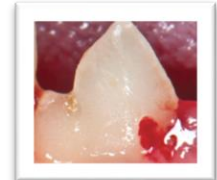
GRADE III

Moderate Tartar
Tartar covers
50-80% of tooth



GRADE IV

SEVERE tartar
Tartar covers
80-100% of tooth



RESORPTIVE LESIONS

"Cat Cavities"
These lesions predispose the
tooth to infection. Treatment is
extraction or crown amputation

Grades of Feline Periodontal Disease



GRADE 0

Normal
Some Plaque
No Bone Loss



GRADE I

Mild Gingivitis/Red Line
No Bone Loss
Reversible Changes



GRADE II

Moderate Gingivitis
<25% Bone Loss
Swollen Gums
Odor is Noticeable



GRADE III

Severe Gingivitis
>25% Bone Loss
Gingival Recession
Sore Mouth



GRADE IV

Severe Gingivitis
>50% Bone Loss
Severe Recession
Loose Teeth
